

## Kuputaka Māori mō te hau takiwā

In te ao Māori, the air is part of the domain of the deity Tāwhirimātea. He is known as the god of the weather. There is much mātauranga associated with the changes in the weather and the phenomena that occur in the sky. Much of that knowledge is localised, so it is appropriate to enquire locally to discover and learn about the tohu or signs of your region or rohe.
